

Percentage of the global population





ISLAM IS THE FASTEST GROWING RELIGION

Muslims are the only major religious group projected to increase faster than the world's population as a whole.

Estimated change in population size, 2010-2050



Projected Change in Global Population


With the exception of Buddhists, all of the major religious groups are expected to increase in number by 2050. But some will not keep pace with global population growth, and, as a result, are expected to make up a smaller percentage of the world's population in 2050 than they did in 2010.

Majority Religion, by Country


Countries are colored according to the majority religion. Darker shading represents a greater prevalence of the majority religion.



Nine countries have no clear religious majority: Guinea Bissau, Ivory Coast, Macau, Nigeria, Singapore, South Korea, Taiwan, Togo and Vietnam. There are no countries in which adherents of folk religions make up a clear majority. There are also no countries in which followers of other religions (such as Bahai's, Jains, Sikhs, Shintoists, Taoists, followers of Tenrikyo, Wiccans or Zoroastrians) make up a clear majority.





% increase in population size



Mohammed, Abū al-Qāsim



Born: 570 A.D.

Died: 632 A.D.


Birthplace: Mecca, Saudi Arabia

Education: Illiterate (disputed)

Islam Title: Prophet

Minor figure in Islam (4x in Koran)

- Merchant trader
- Married a rich widow from whom he gained much of his wealth, but also had other wives
- Children with 1st wife: 2 sons (died in childbirth), 4 daughters (only 1 survived—Phatima)
- Strong interests in religion with exposure to Judaism and various unorthodox Christian sects



THE SUNNI & SHIA DIVIDE


After Ali dies in 661 A.D. there is a dispute over the rightful successor or "caliphate" to Mohammed





SEVENERS

- Believe the 7th Caliphate went into hiding at the age of 5, but he will return
- Locations of Sevener: India, Pakistan, E. Africa


TWELVERS

- Believe the 12th caliphate disappeared and will one day come back
- Location of Twelvers: Majority in Iran (4/5th)

ADDITIONAL SUNNI INFORMATION


- Generally broad-minded and lenient
- Since WWII Saudi Arabia gained incredible wealth from oil & has ruled in a more pragmatic way
- Wahhabi / Wahhabiya Movement
 - Opposed all innovations
 - Adhere to a strict, Islamic tradition
 - Qu'ran & Hadith only
 - Osama Bin Laden included in this group
- The Mahdi is the final Caliphate who will redeem Islam



JERUSALEM, ISRAEL

Significance to Islam


- 3rd holiest site for Muslims
- In 632 A.D. Mohammed was supposedly awoken by Gabriel (archangel) and taken on a winged beast to Jerusalem and from this location was taken up into heaven from the "Foundation Stone."


Significance to Judiasm

- Location of the Temple
- The rock (Foundation Stone) which was to be used by Abraham to sacrifice Isaac

KA'ABA

- Muslims face this during salat (prayer)
- All Muslims must perform the hajj
 pilgrimage to this location at least once
 in their lifetime

RELIGIOUS WRITINGS

Qu'ran

- Allah's revelation directly to Mohammed, not written by Mohammed
- Mohammed is said to have begun receiving it from Gabriel starting in 609 A.D.

Hadith

 Collection of writings about the life of Mohammed which are used today in determining how Muslims should live out their lives on a daily basis

- The Scrolls: 10 scriptures given to Abraham, but now lost
- Torah: The revelation to Moses
- Psalms: The revelation to David
- The Gospels: The revelation to the Prophet Jesus

THE FIVE PILLARS OF ISLAM

Shahada (Witness)

"There is no god, but Allah and Mohammed is his prophet"

Salat (Prayer)

• Pray 5x a day facing Mecca

Swam (Fasting)

- Fasting from all *sensual* gratifications during Ramadan
- Abstain from all food or drink during sunrise to sundown
- Eid El Eftar
 - End of Ramadan
- Eid El Adha
 - Festival of Sacrifice Honors Abraham's act of Sacrifice of Ishmael


Zakat (Alms giving)

Hajj (Pilgrimage to Mecca)

- Travel at least once during your life to Mecca during the month of Dhu al-Hijjah
- Accomplished either themselves or by proxy

RAMADAN – 9TH MONTH OF THE HIJRA CALENDAR (LUNAR)

CORRESPONDS TO THE MONTH THAT MOHAMAD RECEIVED THE QURAN COMMANDED TO ALL MUSLIMS WITH SOME EXCEPTIONS



PEOPLE WHO ARE EXEMPTED FROM FASTING

- Minors
- Elderly
- Sick
- Travelers
- Pregnant or Nursing
- Menstruating
- Mentally Impaired

"... but whoever is sick or upon a journey, then (he shall fast) a (like) number of other days; Allah desires ease for you, and He does not desire for you difficulty, and (He desires) that you should complete the number and that you should exalt the greatness of Allah for His having guided you and that you may give thanks." -Quran- 2:185

^{*} Should donate a meal to the needy

^{* *} Should fast an equivalent number of days afterwards
